

Formed in 1989 in Nashville, TN, the band consists of Marty Roe (lead vocal), Jimmy Olander (lead guitar, acoustic guitar, banjo), Gene Johnson (mandolin, tenor vocals), Dan Truman (keyboards), and Dana Williams (bass guitar, baritone vocals), Brian Prout (drums).

Diamond Rio signed to Arista Records in 1991 and with the release of "Meet In The Middle," became the first country music group in history to reach No. 1 with a debut single. The band is also known for their hits "How Your Love Makes Me Feel," "One More Day," "Beautiful Mess," "Unbelievable," "In A Week or Two," and more. The band has sold more than 10 million albums, won a Grammy Award, a Dove Award, six Vocal Group of the Year wins (CMA and ACM), earned five multi-week no. 1 singles, 22 Top 10 singles, and three certified Platinum and five gold albums.



KENNY WAYNE SHEPHERD BAND 9/22/23 7:30 p.m.

There are few artists whose names are synonymous with one instrument and how it's played in service to an entire genre.

Utter the phrase "young blues rock guitarist" within earshot of anyone with even a cursory knowledge of the modern musical vanguard and the first name they are most likely to respond with will be Kenny Wayne Shepherd. The Louisiana born axeman and songsmith has sold millions of albums while throwing singles into the Top 10, shining a light on the rich blues of the past and forging ahead with his own modern twist on a classic sound he has embodied since his teens.

In a 20-year recording career that began when he was just 16, Shepherd has established himself as an immensely popular recording artist, a consistently in-demand live act and an influential force in a worldwide resurgence of interest in the blues.

From television performances on "The Tonight Show with Jay Leno", "The Late Show with David Letterman", "Jimmy Kimmel Live" and "Late Night with Jimmy Fallon" (amongst others) to features in "Rolling Stone", "Vanity Fair", "Maxim Magazine", "Blender", "Spin", "USA Today" and more, his musical career has been nothing short of phenomenal.

The Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra (JLCO) comprises 15 of the finest jazz soloists and ensemble players today. Under Music Director Wynton Marsalis, the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra performs a vast repertoire, from rare historic compositions to Jazz at Lincoln Center-commissioned works, including compositions and arrangements by Duke Ellington, Thelonious Monk, Mary Lou Williams, Benny Goodman, and many others.

Wynton Marsalis is the managing and artistic director of Jazz at Lincoln Center and a world-renowned trumpeter and composer. Born in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1961, Marsalis began his classical training on trumpet at age 12, entered The Juilliard School at age 17, and then joined Art Blakey and the Jazz Messengers. He made his recording debut as a leader in 1982, and has since recorded more than 60 jazz and classical recordings, which have won him nine GRAMMY Awards. In 1983 he became the first and only artist to win both classical and jazz GRAMMYs in the same year and repeated this feat in 1984.



Celebrating its 50th Anniversary, a new mesmerizing production of the iconic musical phenomenon returns to the stage. The production won the 2017 Olivier Award for Best Musical Revival garnering unprecedented reviews and accolades. Schuur's much-laureled career includes two Grammy Awards — each for Best Jazz Vocal Performance — on Timeless (1986) and Diane Schuur and The Count Basie Orchestra (1987). Both were released by GRP Records, the label that had launched her recording career. Schuur scored three additional Grammy nominations for subsequent albums "Pure Schuur" and "Love Songs", as well as for the individual track "The Christmas Song." Schuur's music has explored almost every locale on the American musical landscape, and her attendant studio collaborations — showcasing her pitchperfect execution and three-and-a-half-octave vocal range — are a who's who of American originators in a plethora of styles. They include the albums Heart To Heart with B.B. King and Swingin' for Schuur with Maynard Ferguson, alongside assorted tracks with Stan Getz, Ray Charles, Stevie Wonder, Herbie Hancock, Alison Krauss, Vince Gill, Mark Knopfler and Jose Feliciano, among countless others. Distinguished producers who have joined forces with Schuur include Phil Ramone "Friends For Schuur", André Fisher "Pure Schuur, In Tribute", Barry Manilow "Midnight", Steve Buckingham "The Gathering", Dave Grusin "Schuur Thing, Deedles, Timeless" Al Schmitt "Blues for Schuur, Love Walked In" and Oscar Castro-Neves "Schuur Fire".







TICKET INFORMATION TICKET EXCHANGES AND REFUNDS

Subscribers may upgrade their tickets by paying the difference in price (service charges plus tax apply). To exchange tickets, the original ticket purchaser must contact the McCain ticket services office at least two business days before the performance. Tickets to past shows cannot be exchanged or refunded. Exchanges and upgrades are subject to availability. Due to the nature of the performing arts, all artists, programs and dates are subject to change.

TICKET FEES

Ticket fees help defray hardware, software and human resource costs required to provide a high level of customer service. McCain employs the latest technology to ensure transactions are safe and secure. Ticket fees and sales tax are not included in the price of the ticket. Tickets purchased for any performance at McCain Auditorium will be assessed a \$4 plus tax per ticket facility surcharge. Tickets purchased online will be assessed a \$5 plus tax internet handling fee per ticket in addition to the facility surcharge. Patrons requesting to receive their single ticket orders via mail will be charged a \$3 plus tax mail fee per order in addition to any facility surcharge fees or handling fees. Single or season tickets bought in person or by mail via the subscription form will not be charged a handling fee per ticket but will still be charged the facility surcharge plus sales tax per ticket. Sales tax will be charged in addition to the ticket price and the associated fees. Handling fees and facility surcharge fees are nonrefundable.

LOST TICKETS

If tickets are misplaced, the McCain ticket services office will issue replacement tickets for \$2 plus tax per ticket. This fee is waived for Friends of McCain members at the Contributor — \$100 — level or higher. When picking up tickets, patrons will be asked to supply a valid ID, and the ID must match the name under which the tickets were ordered. Please be aware that McCain cannot release tickets to anyone whose name is not listed on the order. Tickets are nontransferable.

Please note, the wheelchair area does not have physical seats, but has empty areas for patrons' wheelchairs. DOORS AND LATE SEATING

Doors generally open 30 minutes prior to the performance start time. All events start promptly at the time listed on the ticket. Latecomers will be seated at the first appropriate pause in the program or at intermission, as determined solely by the artist and house staff.

CHILDREN: CONTENT AND SEATING

As a courtesy to our patrons, we ask that children under the age of 5 not be brought to performances, except where clearly noted. Children should be able to sit quietly throughout the entire performance. All children are required to have a ticket, even if guardians plan on holding the child in their lap during the performance. Disruptive children (as determined solely by McCain Auditorium) and their parents will be asked to leave the auditorium. Our staff can answer questions about the age appropriateness or content of a show. However, you must ultimately be responsible for determining whether a show's content is appropriate for you and your family. Booster seats are available at the Patron Services desk by the ticket services office.

PARKING

The K-State parking garage, at the corner of Anderson Avenue and 17th Street, offers convenient parking. Fees for the garage are \$2 per hour and \$16 max per day and are charged 24 hours a day. Accessible parking is available in the K-State parking garage and is charged the same rate as other stalls. McCain Auditorium is not responsible for metered stalls on Goldstein Circle and cannot guarantee their availability. Most stalls on campus not in the parking garage are free after 5 p.m. but fill quickly. Patrons may park in these stalls for performances unless otherwise posted. Remember, latecomers will be seated at the first appropriate pause or at intermission, as determined solely by the artist and house staff.

ATA BUS TRANSPORTATION

Beginning 90 minutes before show time, a chartered ATA bus will begin pick up from Parking Lot A2 with delivery to the McCain Auditorium north entrance off Goldstein Circle. Parking Lot A2 is located on the southwest corner of Vattier Street and Manhattan Avenue. The bus stop at Parking Lot A2 will be clearly marked. The bus will run approximately every 7 - 10 minutes. Last pick up from the parking lot will be at 10 minutes before show time. The bus will return from Goldstein Circle to Parking Lot A2 making several runs after the show. This service is for McCain Performance Series shows at McCain Auditorium


